1 Solar Disc I by Emily Young, Pallant House Gallery Foyer

This giant stone disc was carved from a beautiful gemstone called onyx. The artist calls these sculptures “light drinkers” because they seem to soak up sunlight and glow differently throughout the day. What does this sculpture remind you of?

2 Stik Street Art, North Pallant

If you walk up North Pallant towards East Street you'll see these large, iconic figures created by Stik. Stik is a world-famous British artist whose stick people have been painted around the world. Can you spot any other street art nearby?

3 50 Oxen, Oxmarket Contemporary

To mark its 50th anniversary, Oxmarket Contemporary has revealed 50 individually artist designed oxen, available to buy in its shop. Can you find out what this building was used for before it became an art gallery?

4 The Watchdog, GraffitiStreet Gallery, West Street

Look in the window to find this screen-printed aluminium version of Chichester's well known street art. See if you can discover the name of the artist?

5 John Piper Tapestry, Chichester Cathedral

The John Piper Tapestry behind the High Altar is made up of seven huge panels, each about 5 metres tall – that's taller than a double-decker bus! It was installed 60 years ago and is one of the most famous modern artworks in an English cathedral. What shapes and colours can you see?

6 Carousel by Min Maude, Artisan Gallery, North Street

This gallery is full of different types of artwork created by artists living in Sussex. Can you spot this colourful painting in the window? What other types of artwork can you find?
